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| 1 <i>Ball Handling</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Setting with the hands • Hard driven ball reception • Illegal attack hit • First contact | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Double contacts & carried balls – Demonstrated ability to recognise and call the worst of these faults in a match • Can describe a hard driven ball versus non-hard driven ball in a match • Open hand attack, perpendicular attack – Can describe each of these faults and why they are illegal in a match • n/a |
| 2 <i>Protocols</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Match Protocol • Ball Mark Protocol • Medical Protocol • Protest Protocol | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrates they are suitably organised in respect of pre and post management of the game including personal appearance • If doubt exists whether the ball is 'In' or 'Out', understands that they have the discretion to check the ball mark in the sand • Ability to describe at a high level what they should generally do if a medical injury occurs during a match • n/a |
| 3 <i>Off Court Performance</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Interaction with the players • Interaction with the other referees & officials • Reference to role model • Visibility • Environment | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Interaction with players – Understands & demonstrates the differences between the standards of acceptable behaviour on and off court • Interaction with the other referees & officials – Demonstrates a basic level of teamwork with fellow officials on & off-court • Understands that as a referee, certain minimum standards of general behaviour are expected • Low profile, professional – Maintains a professional approach to fellow officials, players and tournament organisers at all times • Cultural differences – Respects any language and cultural differences of officials and players |
| 4 <i>Teamwork / Interaction</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On court interaction • Cooperative agreement (Between all officials on the court and personnel) • Support • Communication with court staff | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Satisfies the assessor that they have sufficient communication skills to contribute positively to the interplay between themselves and the court staff • Demonstrates to the assessor an awareness of all personnel working in the field of play and whether they are performing their role correctly • Satisfies the assessor that they are adequately supporting the other match officials • Evidence that they have good communication skills with all court staff and know who to approach to resolve particular issues |
| 5 <i>Appearance / Communication</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skills in English • At meetings • On court • Body language • Positioning • Hand signals | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Verbal and written – Must have a good level of English • Punctuality & Uniform – Must be punctual and presentable • Punctuality – Should arrive a minimum of 15 minutes before the scheduled match start time • On and off court – Generally adopts a good posture • Is able to demonstrate the basic requirements of correct positioning when performing the roles of 1st and 2nd referee • Satisfies the assessor that they can use the correct hand signal at the appropriate times |
| 6 <i>Game Management</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparation / Delays / Pace of the game • Control • Knowledge / Application of the rules • Interference and Net Contact | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Satisfies the assessor that they mostly apply the requirement to maintain a consistent and steady pace throughout the match • Is able to demonstrate that they can generally apply the FIVB rules of beach volleyball and that they are able to take control of situations as a match develops. Demonstrates that their decision making does not affect the outcome of the game • Shows evidence of impartiality and that they are generally consistency in their application of the rules • Able to correctly apply the criteria for net contacts and calls the most obvious cases of interference during the match |
| 7 <i>Scoring & Line Judging</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scorer • Line Judge | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is generally able to follow and score a match with some external assistance and minor delays to the game • Is able to demonstrate the basic signals and positioning required on court whilst performing the role of a Line Judge in a game situation |
