Key Regulation Amendments 2025-2026:

Volleyball England have made some amendments to the NVL Regulations for the 2025-26 season. These changes have come from the learnings of previous seasons the teams feedback and VE subgroups and the board.

Key Changes are:

- 1. International transfers
- 2. Overseas Players VISA status checks
- 3. Role of the Level 2 Coach
- 4. Super League Division 1 promotion relegation
- 5. Division 3 Relegation

1. C.3 Transfers v. International Transfers

C.3 Transfers v. International Transfers

(3) Throughout the 24-25 season Volleyball England will be conducting random spot check to ensure that players are following regulations. Any team found to play anyone who does not have the 'approved' International Transfer Certificate (ITC) for that team will be imposed with a £100.00 fine per ineligible player. The International Transfer Certificate (ITC) is automatically sent to players once they have completed their international transfer via email.	 (3) From the start of the 2025–26 National Volleyball Season, all International Transfer Certificates (ITCs) for players whose Federation of Origin is not England will be centrally administered by Volleyball England. There will be three categories within the ITC process: 1. ITC Continuation – For players renewing their ITC with existing FIVB clearance still valid. These will be processed at no additional cost. 2. New ITC Applications – For players initiating an ITC for the first time. An administration fee of £35.00 will apply.
	Players requiring an ITC under category 2 must purchase the relevant event via VolleyZone to initiate the process.

(4) It is the responsibility of teams to ensure that any player requiring an International Transfer completes this before playing in the NVL.	(4) It is the responsibility of teams to ensure that any player requiring an International Transfer completes the process before playing in the NVL. Any team found to be playing a player who hasn't registered correctly i.e. by selecting NVL (Federation of Origin – England) will be subject to an Administrative Dispute as outlined in regulation G 2 where the CWG, has the right to deduct points, fine and suspend any team should the situation warrant it.

Reason for change: At the end of last year VE established that there was widespread noncompliance regarding ITC'S with notice that spot checks would be undertaken throughout the 2024-25 season. Despite this year of grace, an investigation in March resulted in 15 ITC fines being issued to teams. Highlighting the urgent need for central administration and monitoring of ITCs.

Reason for change: To ensure that all clubs operating in the league have a Level 2 qualified match day Head Coach. This clarification of the requirements has been conducted with Volleyball For Life, to regulate a standard that has been gradually implemented into the league. The ultimate aim is to ensure coaching deployment standards to support better welfare of players in the league.

Reason for change: Ensures that those that win their respective leagues in Division 1 are promoted whilst at the same time ensuring all games in the Super League matter right up to the end of the season.

The recommended option does mean that two Teams will ultimately be relegated from the Super League on a yearly basis but it will incentivise the teams to invest into their squads from the start of the season to ensure that they are not in the Elimination Playoff game.

	Relegated teams will be permitted to apply as a 'new team entrant' for the following season.

Reason for change: As the NVL has reached its capacity, this provides an opportunity for new teams to be admitted into the league. Teams at the bottom of the pyramid will need to reapply, alongside non-NVL applicants. There continues to be a high demand to enter the NVL. This season there have been 37 applicants for 11 spaces. The quality of the applications is of a higher standard to some of the current NVL teams.

<u>Reason for change:</u> In response to ongoing safety concerns regarding post padding throughout the season, it has now been clarified that **base padding must also be in place**. After consulting with USA Volleyball, we have chosen to retain wording consistent with previous regulations. This requirement is now **mandatory across all NVL divisions**.

Ensuring player safety is a top priority, and exposed post bases present a significant risk of injury during matches. By requiring base padding in addition to standard post padding, we are taking a proactive step to reduce hazards on court. Aligning with established best practices, such as those used by USA Volleyball, helps reinforce a consistent and professional standard across all levels of competition within the NVL.

Reason for change:

Due to the season coming to an end earlier the registration deadline has been brought forward to reflect this change.

7. Post NVL Playing Season I 3.ix Playoffs

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N/A	viii. To be able to play at the NVL Play-offs, a player must have played in a minimum of three league matches in the current season for the team they are representing. In exceptional circumstances the CWG may
	exceptional circumstances the CWG may waive this requirement.

Reason for change: This rule is designed to maintain the integrity and fairness of the competition by ensuring that only players who have been active contributors to their team's season can participate in the NVL Playoffs. It prevents teams from introducing new or previously inactive players solely for the finals, which could give them an unfair competitive advantage and undermine the efforts of teams that have built success through consistent squad development over the course of the league. The expectational circumstances are to take account for teams that have returning players who have had long term injuries or illness.
